BIBLE/LANGUAGE ARTS: 3RD - 5TH GRADE

Summer Studies help keep our student's minds active and ready to return to school on **July 30, 2020.** Please read carefully as to what concepts your child needs to practice or master and what assignments are due when school begins. Writing assignments are **due Tuesday, August 4th** and will count towards first quarter grades.



The expectations for reading comprehension and writing skills for 3rd Grade are at a new level. Reading books chosen should be appropriate in age level and nature. Books representing violence, witchcraft, sorcery (i.e. Harry Potter), sexual content, etc. will not be accepted for book lists or reports.

SUMMER STUDIES 2020

Read a chapter book (60+ pages). Use lined paper to write a two paragraph report. **First paragraph:** Includes book title, story setting, main characters and if you think they pleased or displeased God and why (based on the Bible). **Second paragraph:** A summary of 6-10 complete sentences describing what happened in the beginning, middle and end of the story. Attach a drawing of your favorite part of the story. Be ready to present report in class.





The Bible is the greatest piece of literary work, and best of all it is the Living Word of God. Everything you need to know about education, life and salvation can be found in the Bible. In addition to the assigned reading, students may use commentaries or other resources to gain better insights as needed. We hope you develop a deeper appreciation for the gift of God's Word. Report is due **Tuesday, August 4th** and counts for both a Language Arts and Bible grade. Use your own words, avoid copying the verses exactly from he Bible. Each paragraph should have at least five (5) sentences. List the verse reference for each paragraph on another sheet of paper. *Example: Paragraph 1-(1:1, 3:8), Paragraph 2-(4:17, 4:21, 5:2)*

READ: Book of Joshua (4th Grade)

1) Make a list of 5 words that were new to you (with chapter & verse where the word was used.) Look up and record definition that applies to the verse being read. Use lined notebook paper. *Example: Meditate (1:8) Think deeply or carefully about.*

2) Write a three (3) paragraph report on Joshua on lined paper. **First paragraph**: Explain who Joshua is & problems he faced. **Second paragraph**: Write how he reacted to what he did to solve his problem and how God gets involved.

Third paragraph: Write what you liked most about Joshua and how you can face a problem you might have like Joshua did.

<u>READ</u>: Book of Proverbs (5th Grade)

1) Make a list of 10 words that were new to you (with chapter & verse where the word was used.) Look up and record definition that applies to the verse being read. Use lined notebook paper. *Example: Perceive (1:2) come to realize or understand.*

2) Use lined paper to write three (3) paragraphs on Proverbs. **First paragraph**: Explain what Proverbs 3: 5-8 means to you and how you can apply these verses in your own life.

Second paragraph: Describe what "fear of the Lord" means and how you benefit from it. **Third paragraph**: Describe a "fool" and what you can do instead to be "wise."

All students will be expected to know and follow Safe and Healthy Daily Habits Encourage and practice healthy habits and home that will transition into the school setting

- 3. Enter grade and math course.
- 4. Click on username in the top right corner. Then click on Learner Home>Teachers>Join a Class.
- 5. If you don't already have an account, press "Create a new account". Enter your date of birth, then sign up by using your school email. New students MUST use the @phcaschools.org email that will be issued.
