

## Class Size

We believe a quality education is related to a lower student to teacher ratio. A report by the U.S. Department of Education stated that "smaller classes lead to high student achievement." The most significant effects of class size on student achievement appear when the class size is kept to a maximum of no more than twenty-two students.

K-2nd grade will have a maximum of twenty students per class. When enrollment is full for a particular grade level, that class will be closed. In some cases, we may decide to close enrollment for a class at a lower student to teacher ratio. Due to our low student-teacher ratio per class, not all who qualify can be accepted. Applications for grade levels that are closed will be taken on a wait-list basis only.

## Health Requirements

All students need to meet the State of Hawaii Department of Health requirements to be allowed to attend school in Hawaii. Prior to attendance, all new students must submit a Student Health Record (Form 14) reflecting a current physical and TB clearance. In addition to academic instruction, students are also taught a biblical worldview that will help them develop moral integrity, responsible behavior, respect for themselves and others, as well as a love and commitment to Jesus Christ.

## Philosophy of Education

We believe parents hold the primary responsibility of educating their children with supporting scripture references from Deuteronomy 6:7 and Ephesians 6:4. As a school and staff, we are dedicated to assist parents with the commitment they have to their children's education. Success in school must also be dependent on instruction and involvement at home.

The Bible is the authoritative Word of God (2 Tim. 3:16-17). Students are taught to accept scriptures as God's truths (facts) and to understand and apply them in their lives. Students are presented with the Gospel message, their need for a personal relationship with and salvation through Jesus Christ, given the opportunity to accept Christ as their Savior, and nurtured to grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Students' spiritual guidance is further enhanced as they observe the Christian role models of our staff, as well as parents' commitment to Jesus Christ and their Godly example (Titus 2:7).

We believe that students should also be developed intellectually and responsibly with an emphasis in the areas of language arts, communication and writing skills, problem solving, mathematics, science, history, and technology. In order to provide the most challenging, comprehensive and factual information, all lessons will be taught in line with biblical truths.

Our bodies are considered the temple of the Holy Spirit (1 Corinthians 6:19); therefore students are instructed in the areas of physical education and health.

## Philosophy of Education (CON'T)

We maintain a staff of qualified educators who have a personal testimony of their faith and devotion to Jesus Christ. Our staff is committed to working with parents towards their children's spiritual, intellectual, emotional, social, and physical development. Our desire is to help students be successful and reach their full potential in Christ (2 Timothy 2:15).

While there are other lucrative opportunities available, our faculty has been called to serve in our Christian school ministry and has made a personal choice to minister here. We are centrally located on the island of Oahu and are called to provide an affordable means to a Christian education for the families that we serve. To accomplish this goal, our curriculum is tailored for appropriateness at each grade level and includes Language Arts, Science, Health, Arithmetic, Geography, History, Bible, Art, Music, Technology, and Physical Education. There are various electives at the Middle/High School level as well as Dual Enrollment College Credit for High School.

**K-2nd Grade:** Student focus is on phonics, reading, spelling, math foundations, hand writing and oral communication. All classes have 1:1 iPads available for students to use.

**3rd-8th:** Student focus is on Reading Comprehension, advanced math concepts, writing skills, oral presentations, more in-depth study of history and science applications. All students are issued an iPad for school and home use. Eighth Grade students will finish the year with a High School credit in Math (Algebra I). Extra-curricular academic activities include Math Olympics, Spelling Bee and Science Fair.

**9th-12th:** High School course offerings are expanded through affiliation with Liberty University. Students are able to take courses at our PHCA campus via an online platform. These courses also include college level credits. All students are issued a MacBook for school and home use.

Overall, our program provides a challenging and comprehensive college-prep experience. Students are presented with a high standard of academic learning with lessons integrated with a biblical worldview to ground them firmly in God's truth.

## Admissions

Students are admitted based upon their previous record of conduct, academic achievement, teacher references and our school entrance exam.

New student applications are accepted in the month of November prior to the next school year. Applications must be received at least one day prior to Entrance Exams that start in late January. Kindergarten applicants need to be five years of age by July 31st to be considered for admission.
