

Admissions

AGE REQUIREMENTS:

Applications are accepted in November for the next school year. In order to be considered for admissions, students must be three years old for *PreK* and four years old for *JrK* by July 31st in the school year they are applying for.

HEALTH STANDARDS:

A copy of student's birth certificate is required. Each child must have a Student Health Record (Form 14) reflecting a Physical Examination & TB Clearance dated within one year from the first day of attendance. All required immunizations must be up to date and recorded on to the Form 14 prior to school attendance.

The PreK Health Record Supplement (Form 908) should also be completed for enrollment. Students must have medical coverage while enrolled. Medical Plan information and proof of insurance must be provided prior to enrollment.

STUDENT EVALUATION:

All potential applicants will be evaluated individually, as well as in a group setting to assess for potential and success in the program we offer.

NOTE: Applicants must be fully toilet-trained at time of evaluation to be considered for enrollment.

FAMILY INTERVIEW:

Before a decision to offer acceptance is made, the final component of the application process is an interview with with parents and child.

Due to our low student-teacher ratio per class, not all who qualify can be accepted. Those who show the greatest potential for success will be admitted.



Parent Communications

Communication with parents is one of the key factors in meeting our Philosophy of Christian Education. Students will have a "Communication Folder" that will be sent home daily. Parents will receive feedback on their child being a good listener, finishing their work, and getting along with others. Homework, if any, will also be sent home in the folder. Parents should check the folder daily, initial, and send back each morning. Any messages, school forms, or concerns should be sent back to the teacher in this folder.

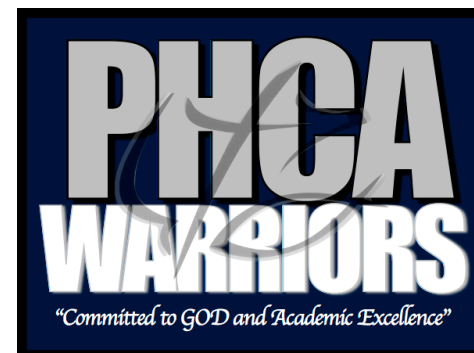
